
A Special Presentation at the Provenance Center New London, Connecticut



Roberto Zurbano presents his "map" of the twentieth century treatment of black subjects, most notably as portrayed in themes of Cuban literature, revealing the singular racialization within Cuban society. In his discussion, Mr. Zurbano illustrates three important moments: The Cuban Vanguard of the 1930s, the advent of the Revolution in the sixties, and the more recent economic crisis of the 1990s.

Roberto Zurbano is the editor/publisher of "Casa de las Americas," a Havana-based cultural institution that publishes the works of writers, artists, musicians, and playwrights as well as scholars of literature, the arts, and social sciences in Latin America and the Caribbean.
